



WORKS NOTIFICATION

NIGHT WORKS, CBD NORTH 15 FEBRUARY – MID MARCH 2017

As you may be aware, service relocations started in the CBD North precinct on 16 January 2017 in preparation for major construction on the Metro Tunnel Project.

These works include site establishment, tree and vegetation removal, relocation and protection of underground services such as water, gas, power and telecommunications and shaft construction for the new rail tunnels and CBD North Station.

From **Wednesday 15 February 2017**, we will be undertaking night works to continue service relocation works within this area. This work needs to be completed at night to ensure traffic on the road and tram networks can continue to operate unimpeded.

What we are doing

Gas service relocation

- Relocating gas lines and mains along Victoria and Swanston streets
- Using open cut trenching which involves excavating down to the required depth, installing or replacing the service, backfilling and reinstating the area
- Temporarily closing these streets at night as the gas works progress.

Traffic signal relocation

- Relocating the traffic signals at the corner of Franklin and Swanston streets to a temporary location to create space within the Franklin Street site for service relocations to take place
- Installing temporary traffic signals at the intersection
- Re-cabling, detector loops, and feeder installation will be completed at a later stage.

- This work will start on 15 February 2017 and is expected to take up to five nights over a two-week period.

Trenching and service installation

- Trenching and installing services across emergency access points along Franklin Street, outside Melbourne City Baths.

Service pit investigations

- Undertaking visual investigations of service pits within the road reserve and tram ways using a camera
- These investigations need to be undertaken at night to ensure the safety of workers and will be conducted concurrently with other night work activities.

Service cut overs

- Cutting over services to transfer the utility to its new supply conduit
- This activity needs to take place outside of peak hours to minimise impacts to local power supply.

When

- Wednesday 15 February to mid-March (weather dependent)
- 9.00pm - 5.00am, Monday to Friday (up to five nights per week)
- 7.00am - 5.00pm, Saturdays
- All reasonable efforts will be made to complete works ahead of schedule.
- We will notify residents and businesses if there are any significant changes to the program.

What to be aware of

- These works (known as 'preparatory works') have been granted the relevant planning approvals to proceed
- There will be temporary changes to traffic conditions in the local area. These changes will vary depending on the works. The community will be notified in advance of works taking place in the immediate area
- Traffic management will be in place during construction to maintain the flow of traffic and ensure the safety of work crews and pedestrians
- There may be some noise and dust associated with these works. Mitigation strategies which comply with the Metro Tunnel's Environmental Performance Requirements (EPRs) will be put in place to minimise disruption to the community
- There will be temporary changes to pedestrian access during the initial stages of work. Signage and wayfinding will be in place to assist pedestrians.
