WORKS NOTIFICATION

SITE ESTABLISHMENT TOTTENHAM

FROM EARLY SEPTEMBER 2019

Major construction is continuing along the Sunbury rail corridor, between the Maribyrnong River and Tottenham station, in preparation for the Metro Tunnel.

To support a major rail construction blitz commencing at the end of September we are establishing a temporary construction site and staff car park in Tottenham. The construction site will be located on a vacant lot at Paramount Road and the staff car park will be established on a vacant lot at 199 Sunshine Road.

These sites will be used until December 2019 for delivery, storage and assembly of materials, worker amenities and construction vehicle parking.

What we are doing

Construction site and car park establishment From early September 2019

- Undertaking geotechnical testing to investigate ground conditions
- Installing an onsite storage shed and worker amenities
- Delivering construction material and equipment
- Laying down crushed rock and compacting with a vibrating roller
- Line marking car parking spaces
- Installing fencing and signage.

Construction site and car park use Until December 2019


- Delivery and storage of construction materials, rail infrastructure and machinery
- Assembly of rail infrastructure prior to installation in the rail corridor
- Stockpiling and storage of spoil and construction waste material
- Worker amenities and car parking
- Ongoing use of the site as required during Metro Tunnel construction.

When

- 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday
- 7am to 3pm, Saturdays and Sundays
- 24-hour access from Sunday 8 September to Thursday 26 September and during most rail shutdown periods
- The site will be used on an as-needs basis to support out of hours works.

What to be aware of

- Medium levels of noise and vibration are expected during site establishment activities as crushed rock is compacted. All other activities are expected to generate low to medium levels of noise
- Generator-powered lighting towers will be required during night works. Where possible, they will be positioned so they face away from residential properties
- An increase in construction vehicles including trucks will travel on local roads to access the construction site. Traffic controllers will be present at times to assist construction vehicle access, pedestrians and cyclist movements around Paramount Road.
