

Works Notification

Temporary single lane closure along William Street William Street, South Yarra

Tuesday 11 to Saturday 15 May 2021

As part of the Metro Tunnel works, underground electrical conduits need to be installed at the William Street pocket park. These works will require a temporary single lane closure along William Street.

What we are doing

- Installing underground electrical conduits at the William Street pocket park and within a small section of nearby road
- Shifting the existing temporary fencing at the William Street pocket part to enable works
- Non-destructive digging (NDD) is required to locate any existing underground services. NDD uses pressurised water to expose assets and services underground without damaging them
- Works will involve the use of an excavator, NDD truck, asphalt equipment and crews with hand tools.

When

- 7am to 6pm, Tuesday 11 to Friday 14 May
- 7am to 1pm, Saturday 15 May.

What you should be aware of

- A temporary lane closure is required along a small section of William Street opposite the location of the future pocket park
- Works are expected to generate medium levels of noise with high level peaks when the NDD truck is operating
- 24-hour traffic management will be in place along William Street to safely facilitate traffic movements
- Local access will be maintained at all times.
