

Works Notification

Partial road and parking reopening Childers Street, Kensington

From Friday 23 July 2021

We are pleased to confirm that the first stage of parking between Kensington Road and South Kensington station will soon reopen to the public.

What we are doing

- Reinstating approximately 51 parking spaces between Kensington Road and South Kensington station including 2 accessible parking bays
- Reinstating pedestrian footpaths alongside Childers Street parking and pedestrian crossings from Childers Street to JJ Holland Park
- Closing the offset parking on the corner of Hobsons Road and Kensington Road and completing the Signalling Equipment Room and Communication Equipment Room access driveway works.
- The offset car park on the corner of Hobsons Road and Kensington Road will be permanently closed in order to continue the reinstatement of this area. Works will include demolishing the remaining existing pavement and kerb using excavators and jackhammers. Concrete and earth works will take place to reinstate the area. These works will generate some high-level noise peaks when breaking back concrete
- Accessible Disability Discrimination Act (DDA) parking will be available to at the eastern end of Childers Street (adjacent to the pavilion)
- The temporary construction site fencing will be removed to allow for pedestrians to move between the parking on Childers Street and JJ Holland Park

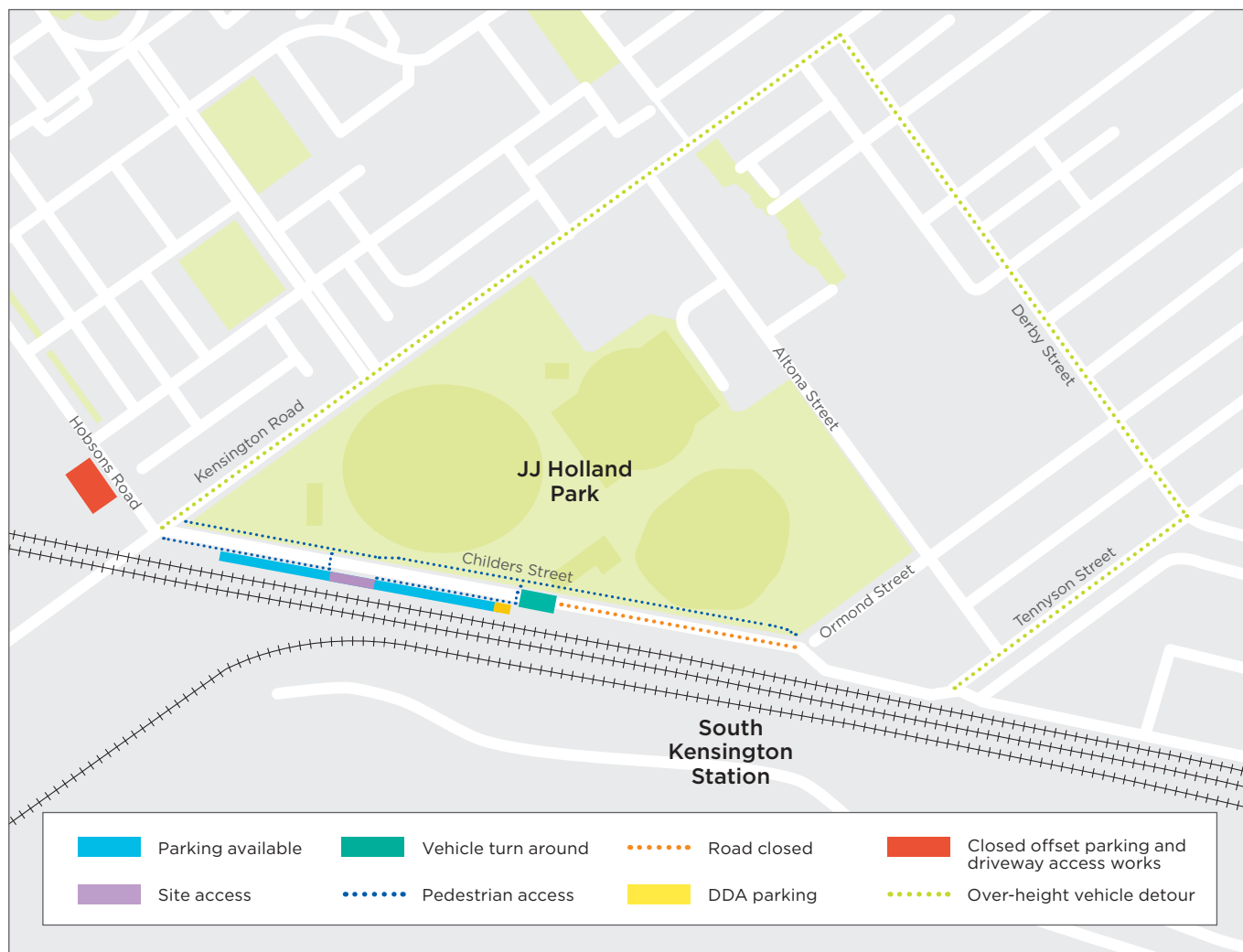
- From 5pm, Friday 23 July

Driveway works

- Ongoing until end of July
- 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday
- 7am to 1pm, Saturdays.

What you should be aware of

- The road will remain closed east of Bill Vanina Pavilion with a cul-de-sac for vehicles to turn around and travel back along Childers Street towards Kensington Road
- The use of the Derby and Tennyson Street detour for over-height vehicles accessing the Lloyd Street Business Estate (LSBE) will remain in place
- Traffic management will be in place to manage traffic and pedestrian movements around the installation of the flood wall tiling and other remaining construction works
- Some areas along Childers Street will remain as a construction site until project completion in 2025 to allow works on the Metro Tunnel to continue safely
- The reinstatement of the next stage of Childers Street is continuing to progress
