



WORKS NOTIFICATION

TRAFFIC CHANGES AND GANTRY CRANE INSTALLATION – OSBORNE STREET, SOUTH YARRA SATURDAY 14 TO MONDAY 16 SEPTEMBER 2019

Works as part of the Metro Tunnel Project continue in South Yarra at the site of the tunnel boring machine (TBM) retrieval shaft.

What we are doing

On 16 September a gantry crane top piece will be delivered and installed on site. This crane will enable the removal of the TBMs. It will also be used to remove spoil as the TBM retrieval shaft is excavated.

Saturday 14 September

- Temporarily occupying car parking spaces between 105 and 139 Osborne Street to allow for the delivery of the gantry crane
- Temporarily moving the concrete barriers on Osborne Street and setting up the temporary crane on site
- Local access will be maintained via traffic management during car parking occupation, barrier removal, and temporary crane setup.

Sunday 15 September (10pm-7am)

- Temporarily occupying car parking spaces in both directions along Toorak Road, between Darling Street and 161 Toorak Road and between 148 and 160 Toorak Road, to allow for the overnight delivery of the gantry crane. The parking spaces in front of the businesses at the northern end of Osborne Street will also be occupied during this time. These parking spaces will be reinstated by 7am Monday 16 September.

Monday 16 September (3am-7am)

- Overnight delivery of the gantry crane top piece. Oversized deliveries are required to take place overnight to minimise the impact to the road network.

Monday 16 September (3am-5pm)

- Once the gantry crane top piece has arrived, Osborne Street will be closed to through traffic whilst it is installed using the temporary crane
- Local residential access will be maintained through a cul-de-sac arrangement on either side of the delivery truck (see overleaf).

Installation of the crane involves lifting the top piece of the gantry crane into place and then securing it with bolts.

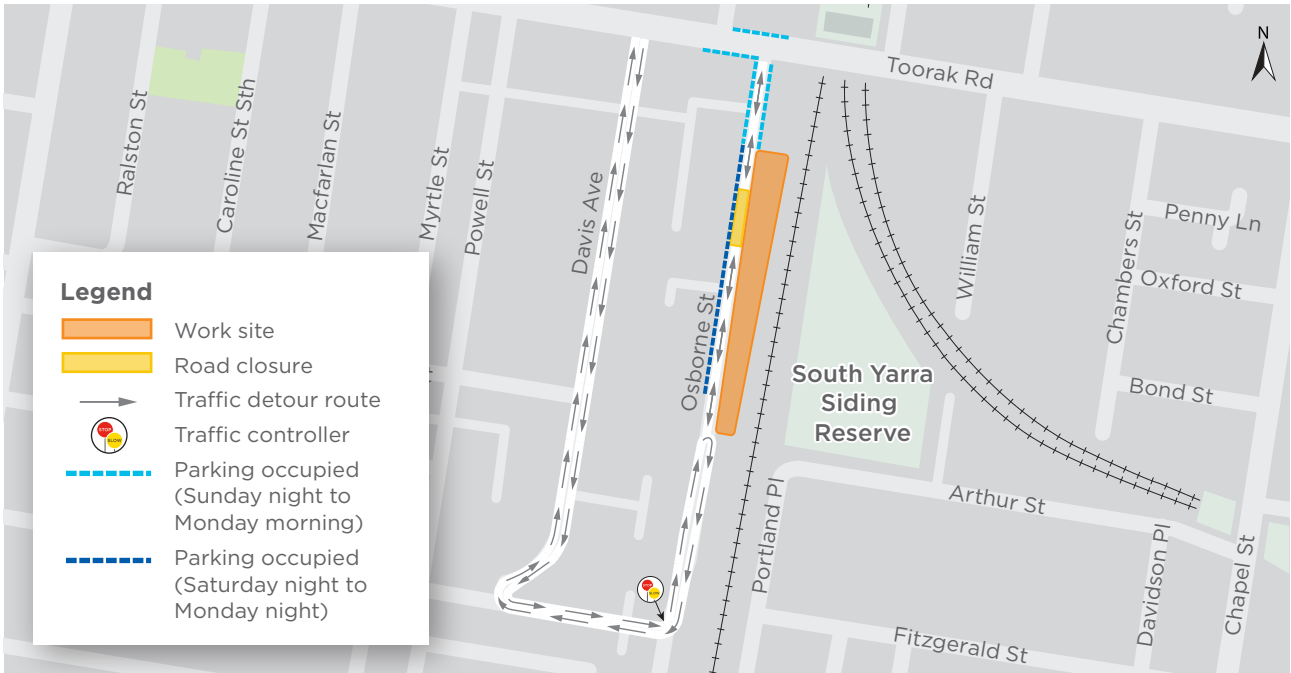
Once secured, the delivery truck and the temporary crane will leave site, barriers returned to their original position and Osborne Street will be reopened.

The works are expected to be completed by 5pm on Monday 16 September. Every effort will be made to complete the works and reopen Osborne Street as soon as possible.

What to be aware of

- On Monday 16 September, residents with driveway access between Fawkner Street and 125 Osborne Street will enter and exit via Davis Avenue and Fawkner Street
- Traffic management will be in place to allow two-way traffic on Osborne Street during these works. Once completed, Osborne Street will be re-opened to the current one-way arrangement. If you wish to use ridesharing and taxi services during this closure, please tell the service to use the detour shown in the map overleaf

- On street parking between 105 and 139 Osborne Street will be temporarily occupied from 7pm Friday 13 September until 5pm Monday 16 September
- In the event of wet weather on Monday 16 September, the traffic arrangements will remain in place until 5pm, Tuesday 17 September to allow the gantry top piece to be installed.
