



MONTHLY CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

DOMAIN PRECINCT APRIL 2019

Major construction is continuing in Domain at the site of the future Anzac Station. This update provides an outline of current and upcoming works in your area throughout April 2019.

Last month, the northern section of the new station box saw 40 per cent of it excavated, and commencement of construction of the new roof.

The southern section of the new station box had diaphragm wall construction continue, with 15 of 35 panels completed.

Some works outlined in this notification extend into early May 2019 to provide a longer term look-ahead.

Construction snapshot

Construction works are continuing within the Domain precinct and will include:

- Northern section station box construction
- Southern section station box construction
- Tunnel boring support site set up at Edmund Herring Oval
- Geotechnical monitoring

When are we working?



Normal construction hours

7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday
7am to 1pm, Saturdays

Some activities may be required to continue slightly past these hours. All efforts will be made to complete activities as scheduled.



Out of hours

Some works are required to take place out of normal construction hours. The timing of these works are outlined in the construction information overleaf.



24 hours

24 hour works are sometimes required during peak construction activities. These are timed to minimise disruptions to the train, tram and road networks where possible. The timing of these works are outlined in the construction information overleaf.

WORKS IN YOUR AREA

Tram pole wire connections

Park Street, South Melbourne
Thursday 4 April, 1.30am to 5.30am



- Overhead tram wires will be moved from an existing tram wire pole to a new tram wire pole. Line marking works within the intersection of Park Street and St Kilda Road will also take place
- These works will require a full closure of St Kilda Road in both directions between Dorcas Street and Toorak Road West

- Park Street residents will need to access properties via Kings Way during this time
- St Kilda Road traffic will be diverted via Kings Way and Dorcas Street
- These works are expected to generate periods of low-level noise and lighting will be positioned to minimise impact to residents
- These works need to take place at night to minimise impacts on the tram and road networks.

Oversized transport

St Kilda Road and Edmund Herring Oval
Between 3am and 7am



- During April oversized equipment will need to be taken to and from site during the late night and early morning. This equipment needs to be transported at night to minimise impacts on traffic and trams
- Deliveries will be made to both construction sites via St Kilda Road between 3am and 7am and won't be unloaded until after 7am. Any removals from site will be pre-loaded during normal working hours and driven straight from site
- All delivery vehicles will be fitted with broadband reverse beepers

Tunnel boring support site

Edmund Herring Oval, Domain Road, South Yarra
Ongoing, 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday
7am to 1pm, Saturdays



- Drainage installation
- Ground preparation works and laying of foundations/slabs
- Construction of roads within the site
- Site shed arrival, set up and preparation of associated service connections.

Traffic and transport impacts

- The St Kilda Road service lane in front of 390 St Kilda Road will remain closed until mid to late 2019
- In the coming month there is likely to be a short-term closure of the road linking Bowen Lane to Albert Road South. This closure is expected to be for three days and will enable the D-Wall rig to excavate the northern most panel of the southern box. Residents and businesses accessing carparks via Bowen Lane will need to exit via Kings Way on this day. Residents and businesses will be notified closer to the date.

Northern section station box works

Corner St Kilda Road and Domain Road
Ongoing, 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday
7am to 1pm, Saturdays



- Continued demolition of the road surface and redundant tram rail
- Continued demolition of the guide walls, hydro demolition of the roof tie-in points on the D-walls and breaking back the central piles. These works are expected to generate a high level of noise
- Continuation of roof slab construction including installation of formwork, steel fixing, and concrete pouring
- Temporary traffic barrier realignment at the southern end of the northern section of station box

Southern section station box works

Corner of Bowen Lane and St Kilda Road
Ongoing, 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday
7am to 1pm, Saturdays



- D-wall installation works
- In early May micro-piling works will commence in the north-west corner of the southern section to build a temporary retaining wall.
- Micro-piling is a smaller version of the piling activities seen on site. It is expected to generate a medium level of noise
- In mid-May initial excavation including concrete and asphalt breakout, pile and column trimming will commence. These works are expected to generate a high level of noise
- Installing monitoring equipment inside the d-walls at various locations in the south box. This is expected to generate a low level of noise
- Decking installation to form a new driveway for 400 St Kilda Road will commence in mid to late May. More details will follow closer to the works for residents.

Long term lookahead: 24/7 tram works

St Kilda Road
25 August to 8 September




In order to commence construction on the middle section of the station box, work is required to realign the tram lines and roadway between Toorak Road West/Kings Way and Park Street, South Melbourne.

These major works are planned to commence on 25 August 2019. The works will be undertaken 24/7 for up to two weeks to minimise the impact on tram services. St Kilda Road will remain open to vehicles and cyclists, but during this time buses will replace trams.

Every effort will be made in the construction planning to minimise the impact on the community, this includes scheduling the noisiest works during the day wherever possible.

Further details on the bus replacement services and the staging of works will be provided closer to the date.

Easter and Anzac Day Period

Please be advised that the Metro Tunnel Project will take a break from major construction over the Easter period.

The last day of major construction work will be Thursday 18 April. Work will recommence on Monday 29 April 2019.

The only work taking place will be the installation of monitoring equipment in the south box on the 23rd, 24th and 26th of April.

Otherwise, the site will be secured with regular security patrols and we may undertake some minor works to maintain our sites or respond to unforeseen circumstances.
