

Works Notification

Relocatable equipment building installation

Railway Place, South Yarra

Friday 22 October to Monday 25 October

As previously notified, works to deliver and install a relocatable equipment building (REB) will take place over one weekend during the 24-hour rail corridor works while trains are not running.

What we are doing

- Installing an REB at Railway Place, South Yarra to house rail services equipment that will support the operation of bigger, more modern trains
- The REB will be built offsite and delivered to the site pre-constructed
- A crane will be set up on Hopetoun Grove and Railway Place to safely lift the building into place
- Crushed rock will be placed along Hopetoun Grove prior to the REB's arrival to ensure the crane is stable when lifting the building
- The REB will be delivered to site on an oversize truck travelling southbound on Surrey Road where it will be lifted over the rail lines from Hopetoun Grove to Railway Place, where the REB will be installed.

When

Temporary road and parking closure on Hopetoun Grove

- 6pm Thursday 21 October to 7am Monday 25 October.

Temporary parking closure on Wilson Street

- 6pm Thursday 21 October to 7am Monday 25 October.

Delivering and installing the REB

- Between Friday 22 October and Sunday 24 October.

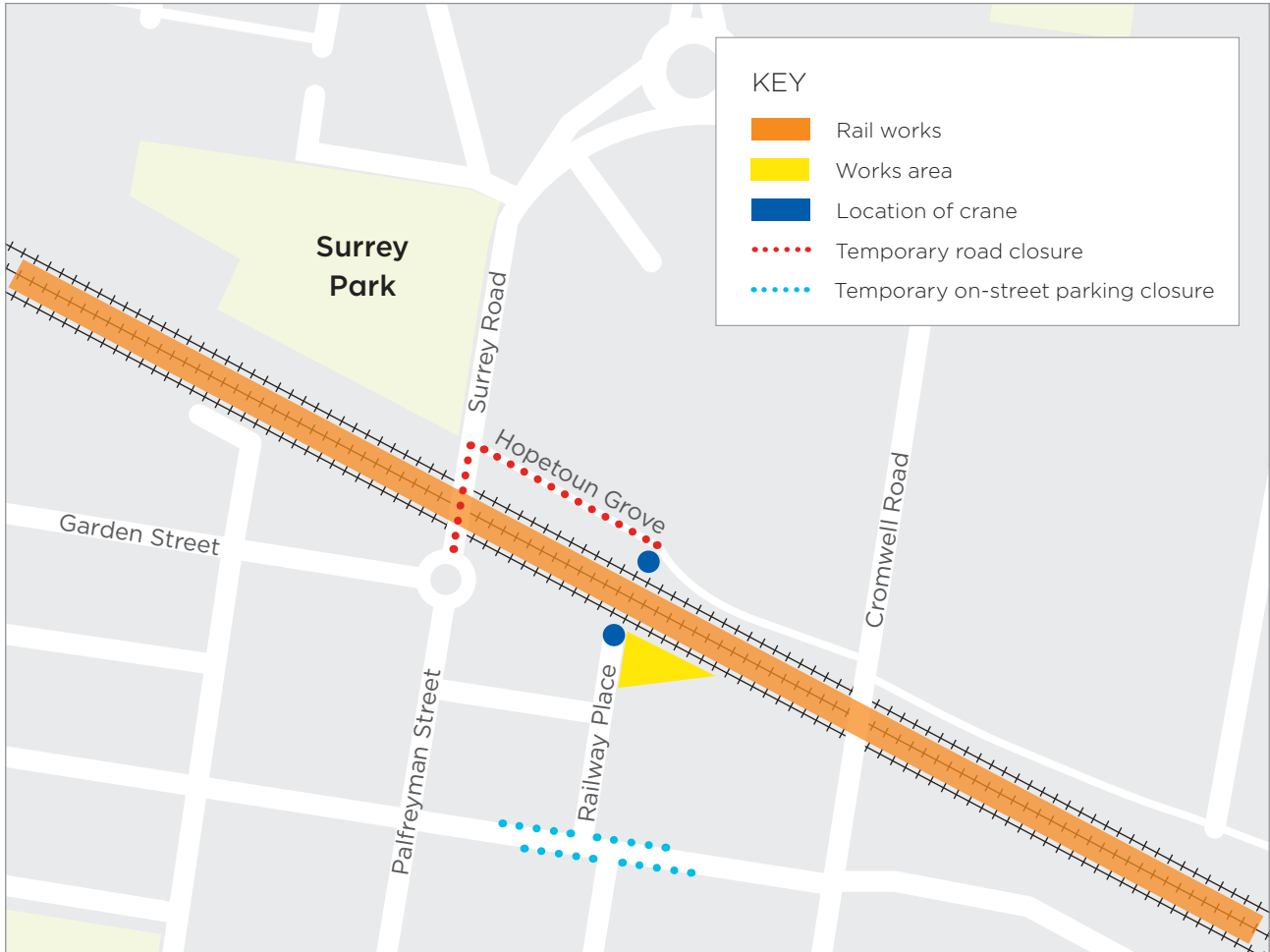
What you should be aware of

Traffic changes

- Temporary parking removal and road closure on Hopetoun Grove, Wilson Street and Surrey Road will be required to support the delivery and installation of the REB
- A crane will be set up on Hopetoun Grove and Railway Place to lift the REB into place
- Traffic management will be in place to facilitate local traffic movement and pedestrian access along Surrey Road and Wilson Street at all times
- Access to Hopetoun Grove and a section of Railway Place will be temporarily unavailable while works are being undertaken.

Noise

- Works are expected to generate medium levels of noise while the crane is operating
- Overnight works will be completed under directional lighting to ensure the safety of our workers. Every effort will be made to direct these lights away from residential properties.



Health and safety

Works safely resumed from 5 October on the Metro Tunnel with COVID-Safe Plans in place to help protect workers and the community.

Strict processes are in place to check and record the vaccination status of workers entering construction sites.
