

# Works Notification

## Temporary single lane closure of Queens Avenue Queens Avenue, Caulfield East

**Wednesday 22 September to Thursday 23 September**

Preparation works to install the relocatable equipment building (REB) at Queens Avenue are progressing, with works taking place overnight in September. These works will require a single lane closure of Queens Avenue.

### What we are doing

- Installing an REB at Queens Avenue near Caulfield station to house rail services equipment that will power bigger, more modern trains
- The REB will be built offsite and delivered to the site pre-constructed
- A 130 tonne crane will be set up within the site compound to safely lift the building into place within the rail corridor
- The REB will be delivered to site on an oversize truck where it will be lifted into place
- The truck will travel via Dandenong Road, turn into Sir John Monash Drive and drive into Queens Avenue, where the REB will be lifted by a crane from Queens Avenue into site.

### When

#### Temporary lane closure on Queens Avenue

- 7am Wednesday 22 September to 7am Thursday 23 September.

#### Delivering and installing the REB

- Between 12am and 5am, Thursday 23 September.

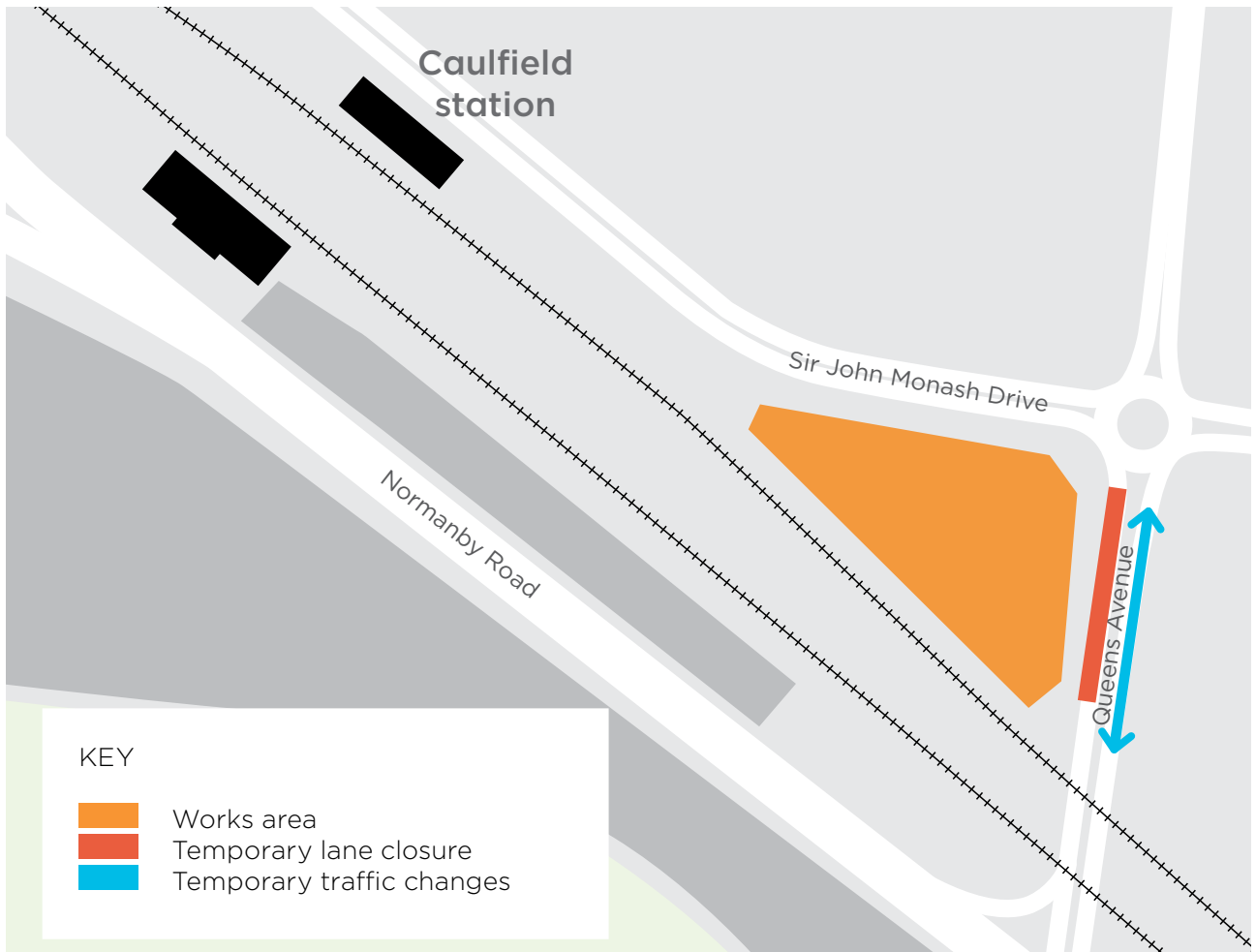
### What you should be aware of

#### Traffic changes

- The north bound lane of Queens Avenue will be temporarily unavailable in order to accommodate the delivery during this time
- Traffic management will be in place to facilitate traffic flow in both directions and pedestrian access along Queens Avenue and Sir John Monash Drive at all times.

#### Noise

- Works are expected to generate medium levels of noise when the crane is operating
- Overnight works will be completed under directional lighting to ensure the safety of our workers. Every effort will be made to direct these lights away from residential properties.



### Health and safety

The Metro Tunnel has been designated a critical state infrastructure project under the latest restrictions. Work is continuing safely with strict COVIDSafe plans in place and we'll continue to comply with all directions from the Chief Health Officer.

We are managing the number of staff attending our worksites, as well as implementing preventative measures to ensure community safety.


Safety measures across the site include temperature screening, additional protective equipment including masks, daily health screening of workers, enhanced cleaning, staggered shifts and break times, and physical distancing.
