



## MONTHLY CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

### DOMAIN PRECINCT MAY 2019

Major construction is continuing in Domain at the site of the future Anzac Station. This update provides an outline of current and upcoming works in your area throughout May.

After the successful delivery of the first large scale concrete pour for the roof of the new Anzac Station, construction is progressing in the northern station box with the next stages of the roof well underway.

The southern section of the new station box will see diaphragm wall construction continue, with 26 of 35 panels completed. Initial excavation of the southern section will commence in May. Excavation activities such as concrete and asphalt breakout will generate a high level of noise.

Some works outlined in this notification extend beyond May to provide a longer term lookahead.

#### Construction snapshot

Construction works are continuing within the Domain precinct and will include:

- Northern section station box roof construction and excavation
- Southern section station box excavation
- Tunnel boring support site set up at Edmund Herring Oval

#### When are we working?



##### Normal construction hours

7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday  
7am to 1pm, Saturdays

Some activities may be required to continue slightly past these hours. All efforts will be made to complete activities as scheduled.



##### Out of hours

Some works are required to take place out of normal construction hours. The timing of these works are outlined in the construction information overleaf.



##### 24 hours

24 hour works are sometimes required during peak construction activities. The timing of these works are outlined in the construction information overleaf.

# WORKS IN YOUR AREA

## Northern section station box deck scanning

Corner St Kilda Road and Domain Road  
Between 6pm and 10pm



- Scanning of the newly laid reinforcement steel must be undertaken for quality assurance and needs to occur when there is no activity on the roof deck
- These works are expected to generate a low level of noise
- For the safety of workers, directional lighting will be in place
- These works will take one night, the project team will advise of the exact date once confirmed.

## Oversized transport

St Kilda Road and Edmund Herring Oval  
Between 3am and 7am



- During May oversized equipment will need to be taken to and from site during the late night and early morning. This equipment needs to be transported at night to minimise impacts on traffic and trams
- Deliveries will be made to construction sites via St Kilda Road between 3am and 7am. Deliveries won't be unloaded until after 7am. Any removals from site will be pre-loaded and driven straight from site
- All delivery vehicles will be fitted with broadband reverse beepers

## Tunnel boring support site

Edmund Herring Oval, Domain Road  
Ongoing until July 2019



- Drainage installation
- Ground preparation works and laying of foundations
- Construction of roads within the site
- First stage installation of a water treatment plant
- In early June, assembly of a warehouse shed will commence.

## Northern section station box works

Corner St Kilda Road and Domain Road  
Ongoing



- Continuation of roof slab construction including installation of formwork, steel fixing, and concrete pouring
- Concrete pours must be continuous to ensure structural integrity. Therefore, these activities may need to extend out of normal construction hours. Every effort will be made to ensure that they are completed within standard work hours
- Site sheds will arrive and be installed within the site on Domain Road
- In May, a new gate on the western side of the northern section station box will be operational. Vehicles will be able to use this gate to enter site directly from St Kilda Road
- In late May the covered walkway outside of Melbourne Grammar School will be removed. This will mean a short-term closure of the footpath.
- Works will include the use of a small truck crane to lift and remove the walkway
- These works will take one day, the project team will advise of the exact date and pedestrian detours once confirmed
- Bulk excavation of the northern station box is expected to commence in late May into early June. Some activities for bulk excavation will extend beyond normal working hours. More detail will be provided in the June construction notification.

- Micro-piling is expected to generate a medium level of noise and will require the temporary closure of the link road between Bowen Lane and Albert Road for six days (See traffic section for more detail)
- Initial excavation including concrete and asphalt breakout, pile and column trimming will commence. These works are expected to generate a high level of noise
- Decking installation to form a new driveway for 400 St Kilda Road will begin in late May
- In early June demolition of guide walls, hydro demolition of the roof tie in points on the D-walls and break back of central piles will commence. These works are expected to generate a high level of noise.

## Service trenching

Northern section station box, Domain Road  
Saturday 4 May 1pm to 6pm  
with Sunday 7am to 5pm as contingency



- Digging of a service trench to prepare for the relocation of the Domain Road site sheds
- These works will use an excavator and are expected to generate a medium level of noise.

## Traffic and transport impacts

### Link road closure (Bowen Lane to Albert Road):


- In mid-May there will be a short-term closure of the road linking Bowen Lane to Albert Road South
- This closure is expected to be for six days and will allow for piling and D-Wall works in the southern box. These activities have been coordinated to ensure the closure is as short as possible. This closure will be during the day only
- Residents and businesses accessing carparks in Bowen Lane will need to enter and exit via Kings Way during this time

### Long term lookahead: Lighting on site

Now that day light savings has ended and winter draws closer, the amount of sunlight each day becomes less. For the safety of workers directional lighting needs to be in place at night during our regular construction hours. While every effort will be made to minimise the impact on residents, you will notice an increase of lighting in the early mornings and evenings.

Any out of hours work will be notified before they take place including their lighting impacts.

The Metro Tunnel project mitigates lighting impacts through careful planning and procurement of the latest lighting technology.


## Southern section station box works

Corner of Bowen Lane and St Kilda Road  
Ongoing



- In mid-May the scaffolding outside of 400 St Kilda Road will be removed and will require the short-term closure of the footpath. Resident and business access will be maintained at all times with some short delays
- Micro-piling works will commence in the north-west corner of the southern section to build a temporary retaining wall
