

Works Notification

Temporary partial road closure of Beatty Avenue Beatty Avenue, Armadale

Friday 21 to Monday 24 May 2021

Preparation works to install the relocatable equipment building (REB) at Toorak station are progressing, with works to deliver and install the REB taking place over one weekend in May while trains are not running. These works will require a partial closure of Beatty Avenue and there will be access impacts to several nearby properties with detours in place.

What we are doing

- Installing a REB at Toorak station to house rail services equipment to run the new high capacity signalling that will be used for the Metro Tunnel
- The REB will be built offsite and delivered to the site pre-constructed
- Prior to building arrival, works to install steel road plates will take place to ensure the crane is stable when lifting the building
- Setting up a 200-tonne crane on Beatty Avenue to safely lift the building into place within the rail corridor
- Delivering the REB to Beatty Avenue on an oversize truck where it will be lifted into place. Oversized delivery is required to occur between 1am and 5am, Sunday 23 May
- The truck will travel west bound along Malvern Road, turn left into Beatty Avenue and drive into site, where the REB will be unloaded by crane.

When

Temporary partial road closure and parking removal on Beatty Avenue

- 6pm Friday 21 to 7am Monday 24 May.

Delivering the REB into Beatty Avenue

- Between 1am and 5am, Sunday 23 May.

Crane set-up

- Between 7am and 12pm, Sunday 23 May.

Lifting the REB into place

- Between 12pm and 4pm, Sunday 23 May.

What you should be aware of

Traffic and access

- The temporary parking and road closure of Beatty Avenue will take place where the crane will be set up, between 4 and 10 Beatty Avenue. Vehicle access to these properties will be unavailable during this time
- Detours will be in place between 6pm Friday 21 to 7am Monday 24 May. See map overleaf for detour details
- Traffic management will be in place to facilitate local traffic movement and pedestrian access along Beatty Avenue at all times.

Noise

- Works are expected to generate medium levels of noise with some high-level peaks when the crane is operating
- Overnight works will be completed under directional lighting to ensure the safety of our workers. Every effort will be made to direct these lights away from residential properties.
