

# Works Notification

## Out of hours works Kensington

**Friday 14 May to Monday 17 May 2021**

In May, we will be working out of hours within the rail corridor, installing signalling, overhead and service equipment along the existing Sunbury line.

### What we are doing

#### Overhead structure works

- Installing foundations for one new overhead structure at the Maribyrnong River bridge. This involves excavation works, use of a non-destructive digging (NDD) truck, installing steel reinforcement and pouring concrete
- Using a NDD truck to investigate the location of services at South Kensington station and adjacent to Lloyd Street rail bridge.

#### Rail services works

- Works occurring within the rail corridor, between South Kensington station to Lloyd Street, to install new steel posts and boxes which will contain new rail signalling cables
- Work will involve the use of a NDD truck to safely excavate holes for the new post foundations, installing and concreting posts into the ground, and fixing steel boxes to the posts
- Installing cables with the use of a cable truck between Lloyd Street and Maribyrnong River.

#### Signalling Works

- Installing new signalling equipment adjacent to McLennan Drive, involving the use of an elevated working platform and site trucks.

### When

#### Overhead works (Lloyd Street rail bridge to South Kensington station)

- 24/7 from 6pm, Friday 14 May to 7am, Monday 17 May 2021.

#### Overhead works (Maribyrnong River bridge)

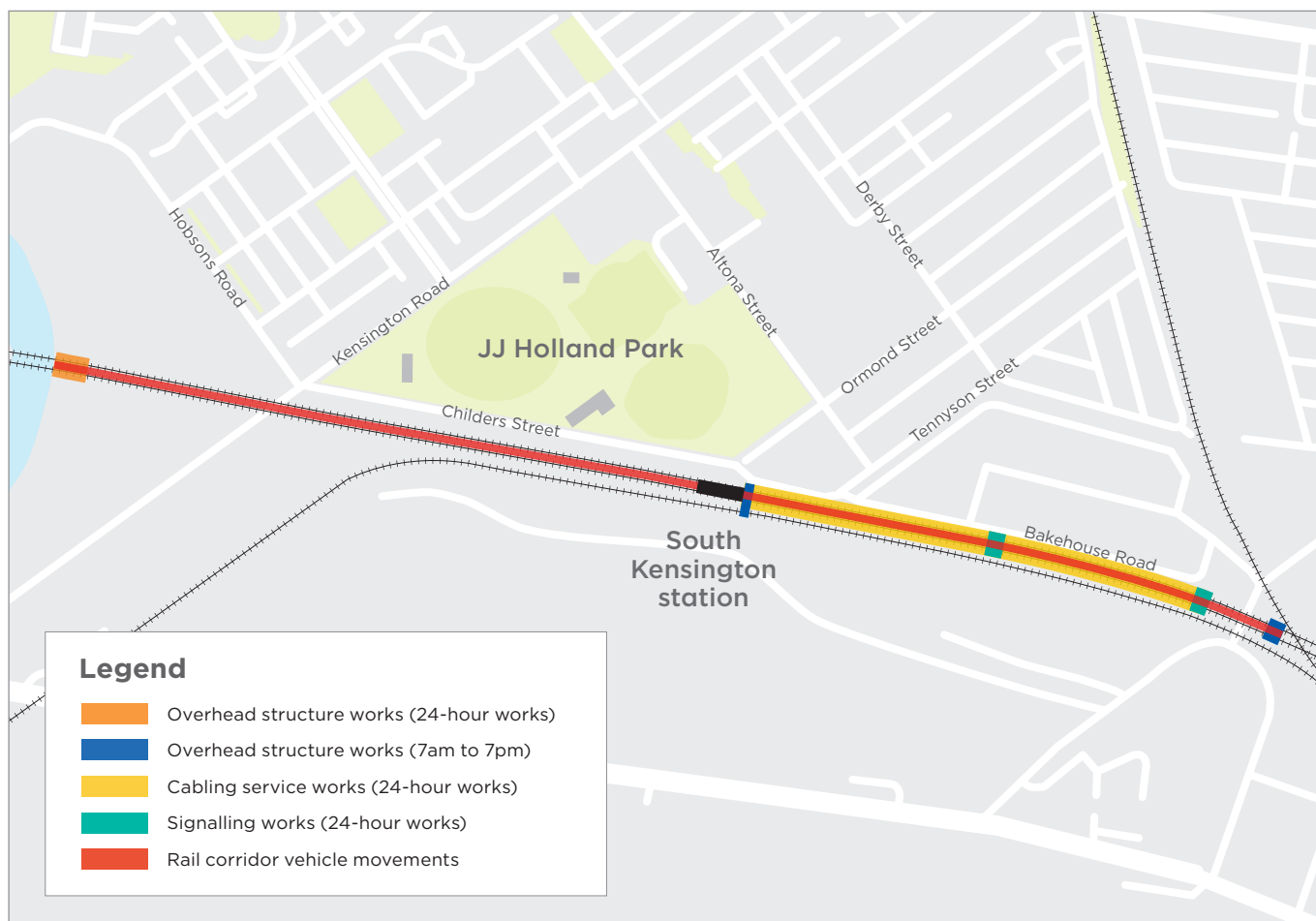
- 7am to 7pm, Saturday 15 May to Sunday 16 May 2021.

#### Signalling and cabling works (Lloyd Street rail bridge to Maribyrnong River)

- 24/7 from 6pm, Friday 14 May to 7am, Monday 17 May 2021.

### What you should be aware of

- These works are expected to generate periods of high level noise while using the NDD truck. All other works are expected to generate low to medium levels of noise
- Machinery will utilise horns and reversing beepers to ensure safe vehicle movements
- Use of temporary light towers powered by generators within the rail corridor. Where possible, they will be positioned to face away from residential properties
- To minimise disruption to the local community and rail users, important Metro Trains Melbourne maintenance works will also be carried out at this time. For more information on these works visit [metrotrains.com.au](https://metrotrains.com.au).
