

# Works Notification

## 24-hour rail corridor works Between South Yarra and Caulfield stations

**8pm Friday 18 to 3am Monday 21 June 2021**

As part of works to connect the new Metro Tunnel to the existing eastern corridor rail lines, we will undertake 24-hour works within the rail corridor between South Yarra and Caulfield stations while trains are redirected.

### What we are doing

#### Rail corridor works

- Constructing overhead structure foundations, and installing signalling cable assets and underground cable conduits within the rail corridor between South Yarra and Caulfield stations
- Non-destructive digging (NDD) is required to locate and expose underground services. NDD uses pressurised water to dig and then vacuum up the soil to expose assets and services underground without damaging them
- Works will require the use of elevated work platforms, generators, a NDD truck, a hi-rail crane, a hi-rail excavator, concrete trucks and crews with hand tools.

#### Relocatable equipment building (REB) works Railway Place, South Yarra

- Works to install underground service and rail service infrastructure
- These works will require the use of an excavator, a NDD truck, a dumper truck, a concrete truck, construction vehicles, trenching equipment and crews with hand tools
- Further information about installing the REBs will be provided closer to the building delivery date.

#### Toorak station, Armadale

- In May, the new REB was successfully installed at Toorak station. Fit-out works including installing handrail installation will commence during this time
- Works will involve a crane, an elevated work platform (EWP) and crews with hand tools.

#### Malvern station, Malvern

- Installing underground services and a REB at Malvern station
- The REB will be built offsite and delivered to the site pre-constructed
- Prior to building arrival, works to install the steel road plates will take place to ensure the crane is stable when lifting the building
- Setting up a 100-tonne crane at a section of the car park near Malvern station to safely lift the building into place
- These works will require the use of an excavator, a NDD truck, a crane, and crews with hand tools.

### Health and safety

Metro Tunnel works are progressing safely under the current circuit breaker coronavirus (COVID-19) restrictions in Victoria.

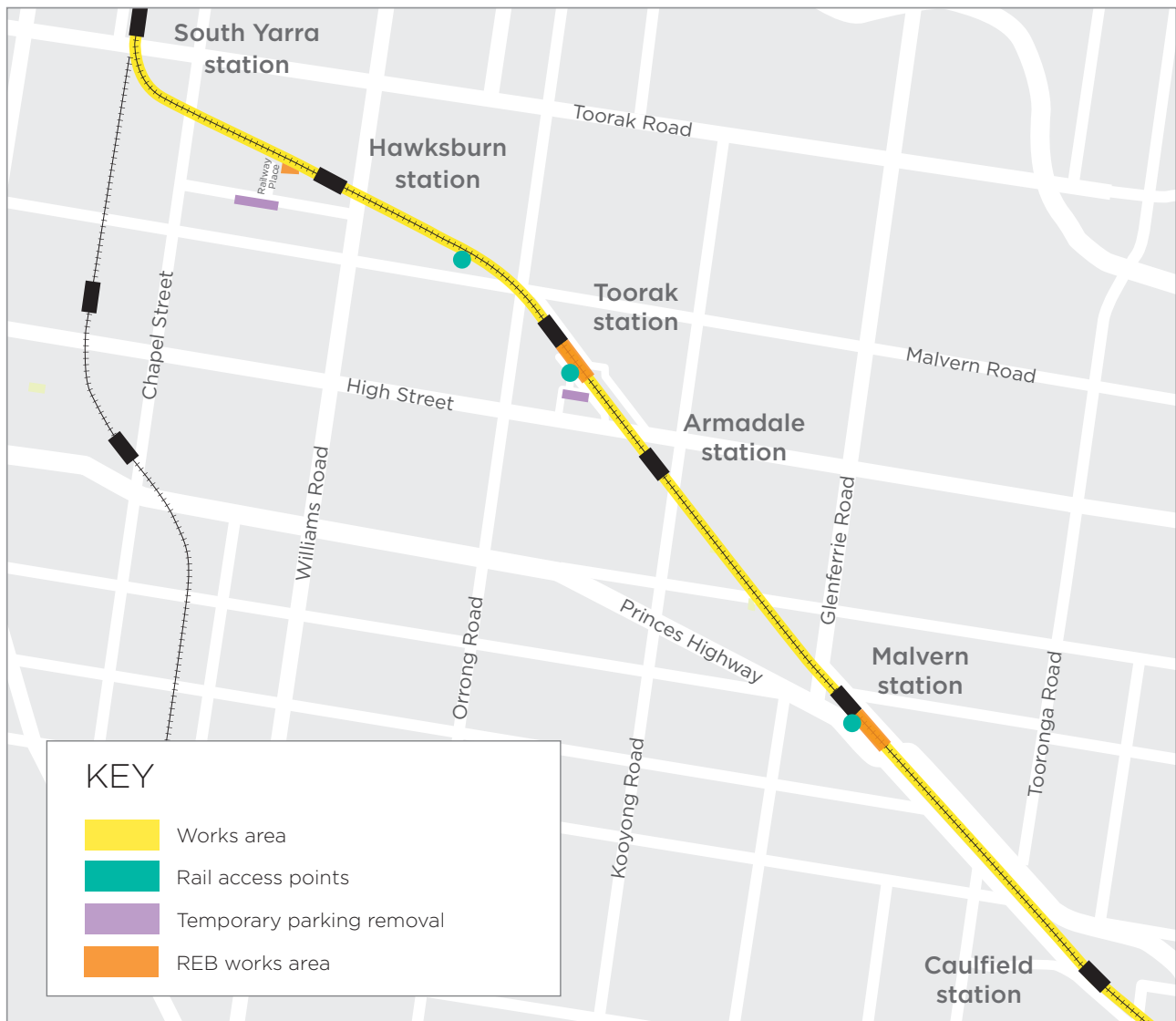
Construction is an authorised industry and COVIDsafe Plans are in place on all our project sites. The health and safety of our workforce and community is our top priority.

Workers on all of Victoria's Big Build sites are currently required to wear face masks unless they meet any of the criteria for exception – such as a medical condition or to meet Occupational Health and Safety guidelines.

## What to be aware of


- These works are expected to generate medium levels of noise with some high-level peaks. Where possible, higher impact works will be scheduled to take place during the day
- Additional truck movements will be required during the out of hours works, as materials are delivered to work sites from our rail access points at Osment Street, Canterbury Road and the carpark near Malvern station
- Traffic management will be in place south of Canterbury Road, Wilson and Osment streets while we complete works
- Some parking spaces south of Canterbury Road, Wilson and Osment streets will be temporarily unavailable during this time to provide safe access
- Vehicle access to local businesses and residential properties south of Canterbury Road, Wilson and Osment streets will be maintained during these works
- Generator-powered lighting towers are required while we complete night works. Where possible, lights will be positioned to face away from residential properties and noise reduction mats will be placed around generators.
