



Works notification

Grattan Street west station entrance construction Parkville Precinct

From March 2021 to late 2022

Following completion of the first stage of station entrance construction adjacent to the Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre in 2020, construction of the Metro Tunnel's new Parkville Station is moving into the next phase. In March 2021, station entrance construction adjacent to The Royal Melbourne Hospital will commence.

What we are doing

- Site mobilisation involving the installation of hoarding and fencing around the site perimeters, implementing traffic changes on Grattan Street between Flemington Road and Elizabeth Street/Royal Parade and on Elizabeth Street/Royal Parade from Haymarket Roundabout to just north of The Royal Melbourne Hospital
- Two work sites will remain in place for ongoing station entrance works on Grattan Street, adjacent to Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre
- Piling to support the structure and enable workers to safely carry out excavation and associated works. Prior to piling commencing, pile pad preparation will be required
- Installing a temporary bridge on Royal Parade to maintain ambulance access to The Royal Melbourne Hospital emergency department
- Excavation and associated works
- Constructing a roof slab involving concrete pours, steel fixing and associated works
- Permanent structure works to construct the base slab, walls and internal structures involving concrete pours, steel fixing and associated works
- Daily deliveries and removal of material, equipment and plant via Royal Parade. There may be intermittent deliveries via Flemington Road
- These works are expected to generate medium to high levels of noise
- Following station entrance construction, reinstatement, landscaping and urban realm works will take place.

Traffic and transport impacts

Ongoing traffic changes

- Grattan Street westbound will remain closed between Flemington Road and Elizabeth Street/Royal Parade
- Grattan Street eastbound will remain closed to general traffic. Access will be maintained for emergency services.

Traffic changes from early March 2021 to late 2022

- The Elizabeth Street/Royal Parade northbound service lane will close from Haymarket Roundabout to just north of The Royal Melbourne Hospital
- Vehicles travelling northbound from Haymarket Roundabout will be directed into the Elizabeth Street/Royal Parade northbound centre lane
- There will be minor lane closures on Haymarket Roundabout and Peel Street to assist with traffic flow for northbound traffic
- Plan ahead and allow extra travel time.

Access to hospitals and services

- Vehicles accessing Grattan Street from Flemington Road for the drop off/pick-up parking will be required to perform a U-turn and exit via Flemington Road
- Taxi zones are located on Grattan Street and Flemington Road
- Access to the Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre loading bay and drop-off/pick-up on Elizabeth Street will be maintained
- Access to hospitals, businesses and hospital car parks will be maintained.

Emergency vehicle access

- Access will be maintained for emergency services at all times.

Cyclist changes

- There is a new bicycle route between Wreckyn and Pelham streets via the Flemington Road shared use path to provide a safe and convenient route while construction takes place on Grattan Street west. Cyclists travelling eastbound are advised to use this route

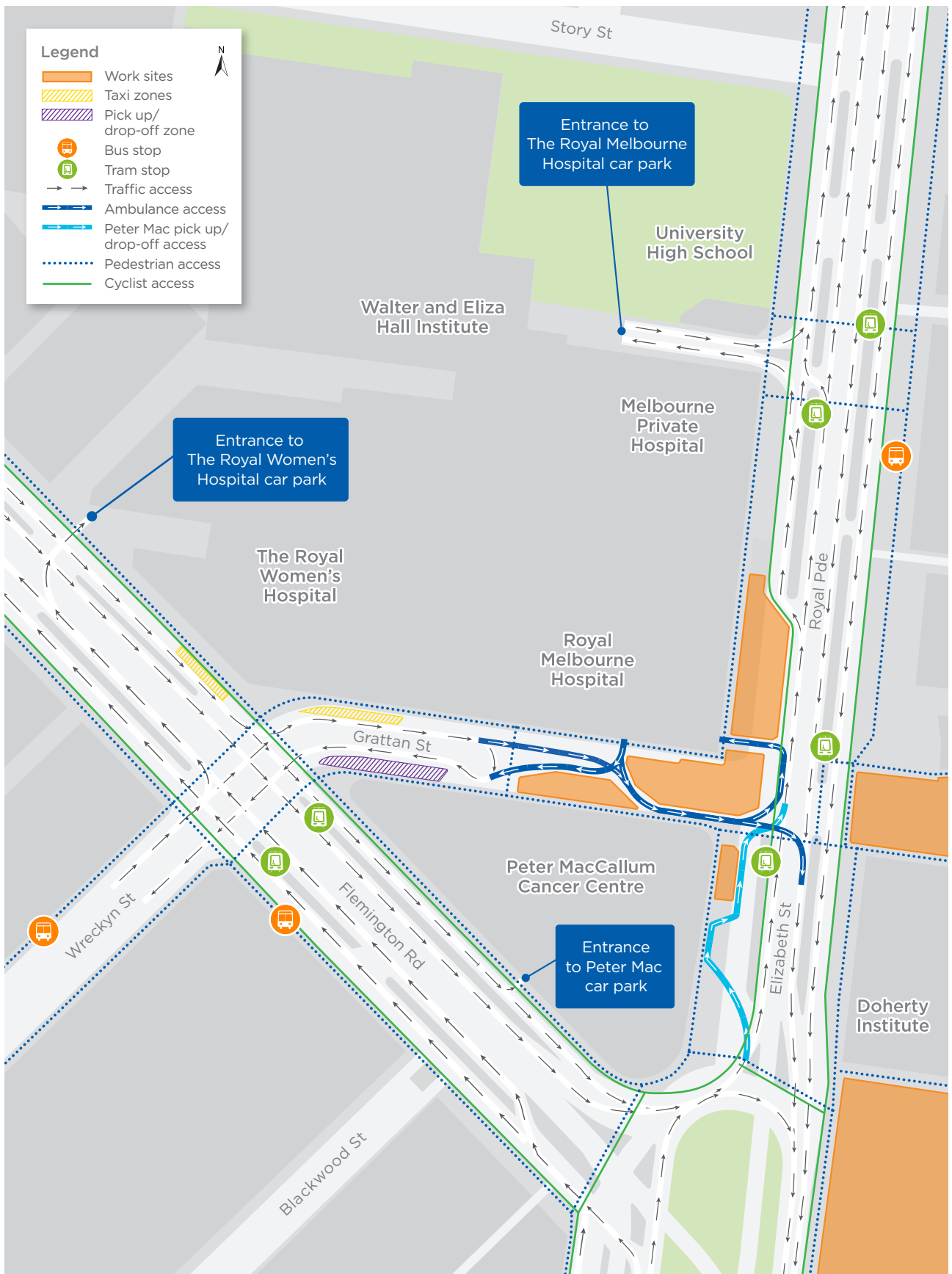
- Cyclists wanting to travel westbound on Grattan Street to Flemington Road are advised to use the Flemington Road shared use path, adjacent to the Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre, or to dismount and walk their bikes from Elizabeth Street/Royal Parade
- Cyclists travelling northbound along Elizabeth Street/Royal Parade from Haymarket Roundabout will be directed into a new bicycle path in the Elizabeth Street/Royal Parade northbound centre lane.

Pedestrian changes

- Pedestrian access will be maintained around the work sites, with localised diversions in place
- The northern east-west crossing at the Grattan Street and Elizabeth Street/Royal Parade intersection will be closed
- The western north-south pedestrian crossing at the Grattan Street and Elizabeth Street/Royal Parade intersection will be relocated around 70 metres west on Grattan Street
- During piling works, there will be additional localised pedestrian diversions around the work site.

Public transport

- Tram stop locations will remain the same. Pedestrian access to the Route 19 Royal Melbourne Hospital/Royal Parade tram stop 10 will be maintained with localised pedestrian diversions in place
- Bus route 505 will not service The Royal Melbourne Hospital/Royal Parade stop. Passengers are advised to use the alternative bus stop at Morrah Street/Royal Parade located 250 metres north on Royal Parade
- Bus routes 401, 402 and 403 are currently not servicing the Royal Melbourne Hospital/Grattan Street stop. Passengers are advised to use the alternative bus stop on Wreckyn Street.

What to be aware of

- Traffic management and wayfinding signage will be in place to safely direct vehicles, cyclists and pedestrians around the work area
- Access to hospitals, including for emergency services, and businesses will be maintained
- Out of hours activities will take place to minimise impacts to daytime operations of sensitive equipment at nearby facilities
- All works undertaken will be in line with the Environmental Performance Requirements (EPRs).
